Dear Members of the HTBAR:

We have some exciting news about our beloved organization. On March 31st, a special called meeting of the Board of the Hood's Texas Brigade Association Reactivated was called. The purpose of the meeting was to begin the process of re-energizing the organization by increasing membership, developing exciting projects around which the members could rally, and increasing support of the Confederate Research Center and Museum. There was a brief Executive Committee meeting, followed by a brainstorming session.

The Executive committee approved the following action items:

1. Jeanne Stovall was elected Recording Secretary until the next regularly called meeting in the Fall of 2006.
2. A Nominating Committee was appointed to nominate persons for current

vacancies to serve 2006-2008, with its report due at the Fall 2006 meeting: Dean Auvenshine, Shelly Rardin, Tom Davis, Jeanne Stovall, Martha Hartzog, Ex Officio.

3. The Proposal to pursue acquiring a certificate of formation as a non-profit corporation in the State of Texas was approved.

Brainstorming Session

To increase membership, develop exciting new activities, and recognize "friends" of HTBAR we discussed the following:

- Update mailing list and gather e-mail addresses
- Update membership rolls and create electronic database
- Send newsletter VALOR at least once a year, plus e-newsletter
- Create website to promote HTBA
- Mark Graves of HTB Soldiers
- Raise funds for Museum Internship Scholarship and support additional needs of the Museum
- Promote HTBAR at meetings of other historic organizations
- Hold yearly meetings and raise dues to \$20 per year: ideas to be brought to the general membership meeting in the fall
- Increase membership categories: create Associate Membership and apply current categories of Honorary Membership and Fellow; also to be brought to the general meeting

Dear Friends,

Over the past year and a half, the Harold B. Simpson History Complex has undergone quite a few changes. They began Spring 2005 with the retirement of Dr. Buddy Patterson as Dean. At the request of Dr. Sheryl Kappus, President of Hill College, Dr. Bill Auvenshine stepped in to take his place. In my role as then Curator of the Center, Dr. Auvenshine and I worked together to make some significant changes at the Museum and Research Center, including converting the Research Center holdings to the Dewey decimal system so that they are more easily accessible by researchers and beginning the process of developing an accession system for the invaluable artifacts. Peggy Fox, whom you all know, continued for a further year to provide us with her in-depth knowledge of the Research Center.

This summer I developed a student summer internship program with four students to develop, implement, and maintain the museum and library collections into an electronic data base *Past Perfect Museum Software*. These are some of the many first steps to be taken in order for the History Complex to start the accreditation process with the American Association of Museums.
